- Boosted student morale and enthusiasm

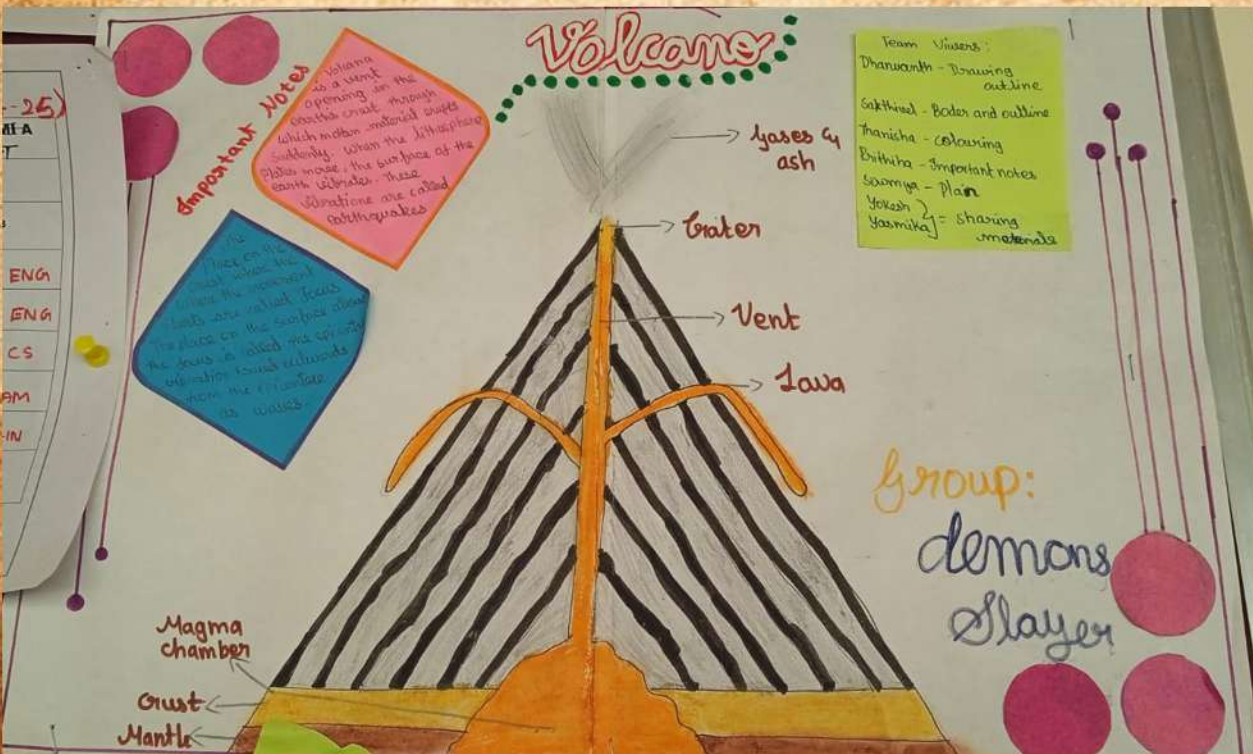
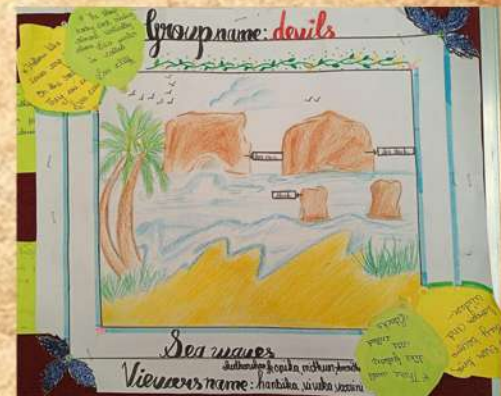


I believe that such activities are essential in creating a holistic learning environment. I look forward to organizing more events like this in the future.

# \*English Week Celebration Report\*

**\*Date: 05.08.2024 to 10.08.2024\***

From August 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024, National Public School - CBSE celebrated English Week with enthusiasm and creativity. Reflecting the proverb, "The pen is mightier than the sword," the week's events showcased students' linguistic skills and highlighted the joy of learning through language.



## **\*Activities Overview:\***

- **Grade 1: "Action word,"** This activity enhanced their vocabulary. English week was an opportunity for students to show their appreciation and ability in English. The children participated with great joy and enjoyment.
- **Grade 2: Reverse Reading .** It is a kind of exercise that familiarizes them with the shapes of letters and spellings system and making their minds remain alert. It helps to check student's comprehension and thinking about the words.
- **Grade 3: "Word Ladder,"** This activity helped the students to learn new words. Besides learning the new words students also learnt how to cooperate with each other in finishing the game. It was done independently by the students.
- **Grade 4: Students participated in "Illusion Reading,"** activity. Illusion reading enables the children to focus on sight words and multisensory learning. This activity boosts the confidence and also creates a command towards reading skill.
- **Grade 5: Students of Grade V have done an activity "Salad bowl"** where children had to pick a chit from many chits from the bowl with a word in it. Students had spoken about the picked chit for a minute. This allowed the students to convey their message in a passionate, thoughtful and effective manner. It helps students to generate and explore ideas through constructing thought webs and reflecting upon their personal experience. Children performed various activities to exhibit their LSRW skills.
- **Grade 2 to 5 - Class Room Library:** A classroom library enhances the students' reading level and provides an opportunity for self- selection of books based their interest. This encourages recreational reading and paves way for a student to share with others what they are reading. It also inculcates the value of responsibility, following rules and keeping things in an organized way.





## **Frame Short Sentences**

**Students of Grade 6 participated in an activity focused on framing short sentences. The objective was to teach them how concise and clear writing can effectively convey ideas. Through exercises that involved creating and reflecting on short sentences, students improved their ability to communicate clearly and directly.**

## **Library Activity and Vocabulary**

**Grade 7 students engaged in a dynamic library activity aimed at expanding their vocabulary. They explored different genres and resources available in the library, participated in reading challenges, and learned new words through interactive games and discussions. This activity helped them appreciate the richness of language and the importance of vocabulary in effective communication.**

**In Grade 8, students took part in a “Word Hunting” challenge.**

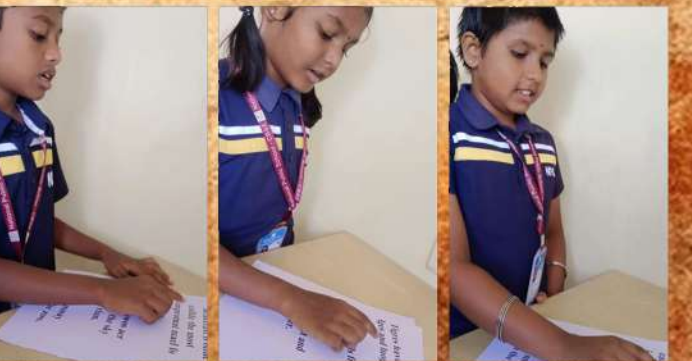

The event was a fruitful one, as many students benefited from the eye check up and the timely intervention of the school helped them to focus on their studies in a better manner.

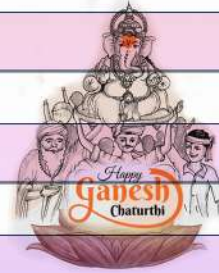

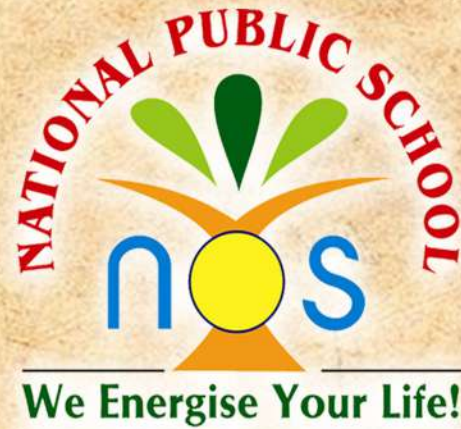
